CONEXUS PROUD OF STRONG PERFORMANCE IN 2016

Regina, SK - April 27, 2017 -- With a growing membership of 123,000 and over \$7.39 billion in total funds managed, Conexus Credit Union was proud to celebrate another year of increasing membership and delivering solid performance at Conexus Credit Union's Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, April 26 in Regina.

Glenn Hepp, outgoing Board Chair congratulated the members and the staff for their roles that attributed to the strong performance, saying "our members have shown their confidence in Conexus and with their continued support and trust, we, can not only concentrate on their financial well-being, but also their families and their communities in which they live."

Conexus also demonstrated a commitment to the well-being of communities with an investment of \$1.13 million in support of programs and initiatives throughout the province. Among the many impactful partnerships in 2016 was the activation of the first national social impact bond signifying a commitment to empower people with knowledge and understanding – and ultimately, the opportunity to help them be better off financially. Conexus entered into the partnership last year with Sask Polytechnic providing the numeracy, literacy and computer skills training for unemployed Canadians.

Another significant partnership was with the University of Regina to restore the old College Avenue campus in Regina. Conexus will contribute up to \$8.25 million to the project generally, and its support will augment the work being done to revitalize Darke Hall. In response to the University's invitation, the partnership allows Conexus an opportunity to build a head office adjacent to Darke Hall that will see about 200 employees come together under one roof to continue their internal support of branch staff, ultimately supporting members and their needs. It will also house the first of its kind in Regina, business incubator, focused on supporting entrepreneurship and small business owners with education, financial advice, networking resources, technical services and more.

"Conexus Credit Union is proud to contribute to the College Avenue Campus renewal project, joining the University of Regina and its many partners to enhance the park by saving and restoring this heritage campus and creating enriched educational and cultural possibilities for our community in the years to come," said Conexus CEO Eric Dillon.

Results of the 2017 Director elections were also announced at the meeting. Curtis Kosolofski will represent District 1 (Regina), Karla Hardcastle District 4 (Prince Albert/La Ronge/Wakaw) and Malcolm Eaton District 5 (Saskatoon/Humboldt). District 3 (Fort Qu'Appelle/Moosomin) was acclaimed by Rick Pattison.

Conexus would like to thank their outgoing board members including Emily Erhardt (Regina district), Gerald Unger (Fort Qu'Appelle and Moosomin district), Don Blocka (Prince Albert, La Ronge, and Wakaw district), and our former Board Chair, Glenn Hepp (Saskatoon and Humboldt district).
